

**Minutes of June's membership meeting**

Members of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met on June 28, 2022 at the Clackamas Community Club, Clackamas Community Club, 15711 SE 90th Ave., Clackamas, OR 97015, at 7:00PM.

Twenty-six members were present, three more attended via Zoom.

President Jim Wheat called the meeting to order at 7:00PM and led the membership in the flag salute.

Jim thanked John and Kathleen Cooper for providing refreshments.

Guest speaker for the evening was Dale Moreau, a professional photographer who specializes in automobiles. He presented a slide show of some of his pictures, including some from his years working with Freightliner's advertising department.

Phil Hall will be presenting at our July meeting, about the Halls' cross-country drive in their 1954 Plymouth.

Jim Wheat will be presenting in August about some historical subjects and a drive to the bottom of the Grand Canyon.

After Dale Moreau's presentation, early in the evening to accommodate members zooming in from the East Coast, Jim Wheat picked up the familiar order of business.

Minutes of the May 24, 2022 meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Jim presented treasurer Dolores Call's financial report, which indicates the club is in good financial condition, reflecting a boost in income from the club's June 18 cruise-in.

Jim Wheat reported that he found the "secret" switch in his 1934 Dodge that controls the dash lights and headlights.

Jim and Randy Ealy reported on the June 18 Cruise-In. A complete report appeared in last month's newsletter. Ninety-four cars – 55 pre-registered, another 39 registering at the show – showed up in spite of forecast rain that became a reality by the time awards were being handed out. IWe gave \$1000 to the Clackamas Community College track team for their help in parking cars, and turned over \$2650 to our scholarship fund at CCC for auto technology stu-

dents. That left \$2000 for the club treasury.

Randy noted some concerns about next year's event, suggesting that finding a location may be a challenge next year. A remodel is planned for Clackamette Park, and it's unknown if they will allow car shows when the work is completed. The Interpretive Center was only a good option for this year because the Museum was closed and the parking lot was available. Returning to the Clackamas Community College campus is problematic because of traditionally low turnout, and rules about food service rather than attracting vendors. The cruise-in committee will have a lot to discuss when they start meeting again.

Randy reported that thirty per cent of the attendees at our event got awards.

Joanne Dixon was presented with some potted flowers as a thank-you for her efforts at fundraising and raffle items, and Joanne made a point of recognizing Donna Bade, who was not present, for her efforts.

Mike Bade was recognized for his work on the cruise-in.

Jim Wheat raised the possibility of quarterly club meetings, instead of the sparsely-attended monthly meetings we're doing currently. He also suggested we consider a change in time and/or location during winter months as more members have difficulty driving at night. Board members are ready to receive feedback.

Dave Benfield announced the Mopar Nationals at Woodburn Drag Strip on July 17. (Story and pictures in this newsletter, pages 1 and 4).

Jake Higginbotham announced that Finn's Auto Restoration of Woodburn is producing a car show called Horsepower on the Green at Arrowhead Golf Club in Woodburn on July 23. Proceeds will go to children and families in need.

Member Care: Pam Ealy reported that Dennis Mowery's hip replacement had been successful and he was in attendance at the meeting. Joanne Dixon reported that Joyce Catt has asked to be removed from the club roster primarily because she's sad that she can't partici-

The board of directors of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met on July 12, 2022, at Elmer's Restaurant in Clackamas, Oregon.

Present were Dolores Call, Mike Bade, Joanne Dixon, Jim Wheat, Jake Higginbotham and Robin Will. Robin Will took the minutes.

Board President Mike Bade called the meeting to order at 11:51AM.

Minutes of the June 14, 2022 board meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter.

Dolores Call's treasurer's report was approved as submitted. CPPC is in excellent financial health. We don't publish our bank balance – any board member can provide information.

Mike Bade reported an additional net \$546 in eBay sales.

Car Show Update: Randy Ealy is stepping down from the job of car show coordinator, and the board is looking for a replacement for next year. Randy leaves a loose-leaf binder full of step-by-step instructions and budgets, so his successor's job should be easy.

In related news, remodeling at Clackamette Park may put the park out of reach for next year's show. The End of the Oregon Trail parking lot won't be available after the museum re-opens, and the idea of returning to the Clackamas Community College campus isn't attractive (1) because of the small number of cars we were able to attract there, and (2) because of CCC-related requirements for vendors and food service. Jim Wheat mentioned that the park at Charbonneau is big enough to host a

car show, and he'll check on availability.

July's Membership Meeting: Phil Hall will share pictures and commentary about the Halls' recent cross-country trip in their 1954 Plymouth Belvedere. To accommodate visitors via Zoom from other time zones, Phil's talk will come early in the agenda, with other club business to follow.

The August meeting is traditionally CPPC's annual hot-dog feed. Mike Bade will check into planning for the event.

General Meeting Scheduling: There was discussion but no conclusion about re-scheduling meeting times, keeping the date but changing the hours, or moving to a quarterly meeting schedule. The board suggests a club-wide survey – by email for those with computers, and by phone for those who don't do email – to get an idea where members stand on the question.

Mike commented that he would be attending the Mopar Nationals at Woodburn Drag Strip on July 17, and needed to gather materials for membership packets in case other attendees were interested in our club. Membership packets were something we let slide during COVID. Mike will use supplies he has on hand and will see what needs updating.

Joanne Dixon reported that she had made efforts to contact Beaches about our customary place in their Wednesday night line-up, had had no response, and would keep trying.




