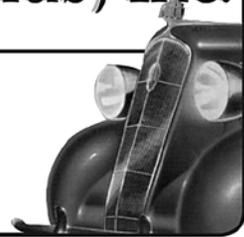


Share on social media. Share from the club's Facebook page, or use the information we email you to create your own post to let your friends know what



Minutes of April's membership meeting

Members of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met on April 26, 2022, at 7:00PM in the Clackamas Community Club, 15711 SE 90th Ave., Clackamas, OR 97015.

Twenty-three members were in attendance, and four more attended via Zoom.

President Jim Wheat called the meeting to order at 7:00PM and led the flag salute.

One guest was present: Mark Childs introduced his son, Cameron.

Club members acknowledged Stephanie Willis for providing refreshments.

There were no minutes to approve from last meeting due to the loss of acting-secretary Robin Will's notes, and the need for a couple of secretaries to record club business was mentioned, again.

The financial report was accepted without comment.

There was general discussion about the gas-station mural that Bill Call donated to the club many years ago. Matthews Memory Lane is enthusiastic about getting the mural and putting it on display, but first we need to determine its condition after years of storage. Board members are waiting for a dry day to unroll it outdoors, and see if it's okay.

There was general discussion about eBay sales, which have kept the club afloat during the COVID shutdown. The board has directed that henceforth, members who market donated club items on eBay should keep half of the proceeds of the sales, on an honor system.

There was general discussion but no decision on a suggestion to move CPPC meetings to a weekend-daytime slot, to possibly accommodate a wider variety of members and eliminate the need to drive at night. The board will keep the question under consideration.

CPPC gained one new member from Portland Swap Meet: Dave Olson turned in his application by mail.

For potential activities, Mike Bade reported he had 100 sign-ups for the tour of The Brothers' collection in Salem on May 3.

Jim Wheat mentioned the Car and Classic Boat show in Lake Oswego on August

18, an event that is held at three locations in the city.

A member confirmed that the Cutsforth Cruise-in will be back in the park in Canby on August 27, after a successful drive-through event at the fairgrounds last year.

A status report on our own show, Cruise-In Down By the Riverside, said that online pre-registrations are ahead of last year. Joanne Dixon reported on award sponsors, raffles, goodie bags and silent auctions. Six companies have contributed more than \$50, with the extra funds going directly to scholarships, and one of the O'Reilly stores has a check for \$750 waiting to be picked up.

The evening's program was a double-header. Phil Lapin thoroughly documented the restoration of his 1942 Plymouth Deluxe sedan – the car the Tech Committee dragged out of a barn in Orchards, WA in January, 2015. Phil combined the pictures into a video, with musical background, and we watched the Patina Princess transformed into its new identity as Mellow Yellow. Jim Wheat filled the remainder of the program with pictures of an old church he has been restoring/maintaining in his old home town in California.

Tom Nachand pointed out that the newest Plymouth Owners Club Bulletin features Phil and Roseann Hall's 1954 Plymouth Belvedere.

Jim Wheat won the 50/50 pot. John Cooper, Cameron Childs, Judie Byrnes, and the Dixons took home door prizes.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:25PM.

Cutsforth's Car Show - August 27th – The event will be back in the park in the middle of Canby this year. Google cutsforthscruisein.com for info.



The word about The Brothers Car Collection in Salem is getting out, more and more. The collection of over 350 beautifully restored cars and Neon Signs in the collection is not something you would expect to find in Salem, Oregon; but in a much larger metropolitan area.

Last fall Mike Bade arranged a tour to The Brothers Car Collection and about 45 people attended and he thought that was a good number.

To be sure he had enough people for the May 3 tour, Mike decided to invite the WPC, Studebaker and HACO Car Clubs. Next, other car clubs wanted to join in, the Cadillac and Ford V-8 Car Clubs; random people also called up to join in for the tour.

The list grew: Mike had to call the Brothers Collection and see if 75 was too many, then if 100 was too many and finally if 150 was too many; each time they said that would be fine; they can handle over 200.

Days leading up to the tour the count had reached 145 wanting to come. The day of the tour only 125 would show up, will a pretty good number. Some forgot, a few with health conditions and a few, I am not sure why. The ones who attended had a good time, seeing all of the amazing cars on display.

The collection consists of 50's and 60's Muscle Cars and Motorcycles, many of which are unique and rare, a must see for every car enthusiast in the Portland Metro area.

For Mike, it was another opportunity or excuse to take more pictures of all the cars. He adds them to his collection and makes photo books or art out of them when he gets time.

The eponymous brothers who own the collection are Paul and Bob Milhous. They seem to keep a low profile.

They charge for viewing of the collection, which is possible for groups of a certain size, by appointment only,

The Board of Directors of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met Tuesday, May 20, 2022, at Elmer's Restaurant in Clackamas, Oregon.

Present at the meeting were Jake Higginbotham, Jim Wheat, Mike Bade, Dolores Call, Jerry and Joanne Dixon, and Robin Will. Robin Will took the minutes. Arnold Landvoigt, a CPPC member visiting from Maryland, was a surprise guest at the meeting.

Mike Bade called the meeting to order at 11:53. Minutes of the April 12 meeting were approved as published in the newsletter. Treasurer Dolores Call's report was approved as submitted. CPPC doesn't publish our bank balances, but the club remains in solid financial condition. Ask any board member for information.

Speaker for the May 24 membership meeting will be Arn Landvoigt, who will be back in Maryland by that time. He'll present a 92-year-old murder mystery that involves a murdered Federal agent and a 1929 Pontiac.

There were updates on behind-the-scenes organizing for the cruise-in: getting city permits, confirming that the Lions Club will be there to cook breakfast, making sure the pie ladies planned to attend, negotiating the business of food handler permits, making sure the waiver of the business license requirement was in place, and getting the site plan to map out parking areas and locating the sprinklers.




