By Phil Lapin Some of you readers may know the history of overdrive transmissions

used in early Chrysler Corporation vehicles. They were used as early as 1934 in Chrysler and DeSoto cars – but not (for some reason) in Plymouths. Interestingly, a standard 3 speed Plymouth transmission from the early 1940s can be replaced with an overdrive transmission from the other Chrysler brands – and it is an identical fit. The overdrive portion replaces the long tail shaft of a standard 3 speed. I have attached a photo of an overdrive transmission ready to go into my 1942 Plymouth.

But – this little article is not a detailed story of overdrives, but rather a QUIZ for you! Here we go:

D. J. Freeman reports he has a "Dodge in disguise"

In the May-June Plymouth Bulletin there was an article about Trim Codes for '37 Plymouths, and it explained how to get a FREE build sheet. I sent what info I have on my '37 and my '38.

Just got the Free build sheet on both cars. It is something everybody might want for their car.

I found that my '37 was built in Michigan by Briggs manufacturing. It was build for Central Sales & Service, Sunbury, PA. August 20, 1937. It even says it was shipped with a Goodyear 4-ply spare tire.

Now about my '38. I got it totally disassembled. I sent all the info I had for the build sheet. I knew from my own research it was a California build. The build sheet confirmed that. It was build in Los Angeles, CA on February 24, 1938 for Dalton Motors Inc. Sacramento, CA.

Now for the not so surprising info. The fire wall (engine compartment) is stamped "D5 17443". That number doesn't show up on the build sheet but the body number 3106445 is on the top of the build sheet. As I had suspected, it is a '38 STD BUS COUPE DODGE. So, I have a Dodge body and I assembled it with a P5 (Plymouth) dash and front end. It's like my Dodge has a false nose and mustache.

The build sheets have other info, like the key codes for the Trunk and Door, Trim and Paint codes, 5 steel wheels, Safety glass on the '38.

Great info and it only took a couple of months to reply with the Free build sheet.
