## **May Technical Tips**

REAR WHEEL BEARING LUBRICATION Rear Wheel Bearings:

Use a short fiber wheel bearing grease, (Medium).

Remove the plugs on the rear side of the axle housing near the brake support plates, then lubricate with 1/2 ounce of recommended lubricant, using a low pressure gun. Replace the plug.

DO NOT OVER-LUBRICATE.

If a relief plug is use on the grease gun, the exact amount of lubricant can be applied. Over lubrication may result in grease leaking past the seals onto the brake linings.

DO NOT Lubricate any rubber parts, such as the sway bar bushings, shock absorber mountings and rear spring shackle bushings. They are designed to operate without lubrication. Lubricating them will cause them to slip and result in rapid wear.

### May, Safety First:

### SAFETY TIPS:

#### Operating A Vehicle

We are about to start driving our Old Plymouths and or other makes of vehicles. It is always a good policy to check our vehicles over for safe operation before we attempt to drive

- 1. Did we check the Head Lights?
- 2. Did we check the Tail Lights?
- 3. Did we check the Brake Lights?
- 4. Did we check the Foot Brake?
- 5. Did we check that Emergency Brake?
- 6. Did we check the Windshield Wipers?
- 7. Did we check the Horn?
- 8. Did we check to see if we have enough Oil in the crankcase of the Engine? 9. Did we check the Gasoline tank IF IT WAS full?
- 10. Did we check the Water in the Radiator?
- 11. Did we check the Tires for Air Pressure?
- 12. Did we have a look under the car for any Oil, Water and or Gasoline leaks?
- 13. Do we have Reflective devises to warn others if we break down?
- 14. Did we check that spare tire for air pressure?
- 15. Did we check the Turn Signals if so equipped?

All of the above and more are very important to the operation of the vehicle. If one of the above fails to do it's job, one could be stalled on a roadway, which will set up a hazard for yourself as well as others who may be using the roadway.

If you do have something to cause you to make a stop, try your very best to be moved off of the roadway to clear the path of oncoming traffic, be it the same direction you are traveling or the opposite direction.

Place warning devices along the edge of your vehicle, then another about 100 feet in back of your vehicle, and then another about 100 feet in back of the second warning device, A white rag hanging on an antenna, but leaving the roadway clear. If you have Lighted Flares to use, DO NOT use if you have a Gasoline leak. Use something that will not set fire to the Gasoline.

Make sure all passengers are out of and away from the vehicle
