# Bades drive 30U Coupe to Orphan Car Show!

Here's the kind of story we like to tell: a 40-year project, once again getting around under its own power.

That's right: 40 years. Mike Bade bought this 1930 Plymouth 30U as a basket case, for \$100, 40 years ago, and the basket wasn't included.

Mike's first impulse was to make a dragster, he recalls.

The drag-strip dreams faded quickly, and instead, Mike did a low-budget, frame-off restoration. He enjoyed the car in restored form through his last two years at Eastern Washington University, where he met Donna.

Shortly after their marriage in 1979, the '30U developed an engine knock that sounded like big trouble, and Mike put the coupe away until he had time to work on it.

Between career, home, kids, and life in general, there wasn't much time for about 30 years. By that time, the vision had changed again: not a dragster, and not another restoration, but the old coupe sure would make a nice hot rod.

That's how it ended up, with a little

help from his friends in the Plymouth Club. A Dodge Dakota V6 motivates the coupe these days, through an automatic transmission, and there's even air-conditioning.

Mike and Donna drove the '30U to the Orphan Car Show on June 24, 2012 - the first time this car has been out of the garage under its own power since about 1979.

There's still work to do, but hey, isn't there always work to do on an old car? The coupe was going in to Mitch Kim's for pinstriping early in July, and we'll be posting fresh pics to the car's web page as work progresses.

The board is discussing raising dues to \$25.00 a year to help cover our deficit. This could possibly bring in an extra \$600.00 in revenue per year.


Another cost-cutting measure is emailing the newsletter to save postage, beginning next year. Member input will be solicited.

# Order your car's build sheet from Chrysler museum site

Jerry Dixon shared a resource for MOPAR owners: Chrysler Historical Services offers owners manuals, factory photographs, and build sheets for most of the cars Chrysler has ever made.

Records go back to 1915, and include predecessor brands including Rambler, Nash, Hudson, and Willys-Overland along with the whole Chrysler Corporation lineup.

Expect to pay \$25 for a duplicate owner or service manual, \$25-\$45 for the build sheet for your car.

In addition to the items you can order, there is a large web-based archive of heritage information.

It's all explained on the website of the Walter P. Chrysler Museum,



Dixons' 1967 Barracuda took the #1 spot in the 1965-1969 class.





# 1960 Plymouth XNR - one of one

(Excerpted from Hemmings.com)

This one-off concept car, Virgil Exner Sr.'s 1960 Plymouth XNR – will cross the block in August at RM's Monterey auction.

Designed and built to explore the idea of a driver-centric automobile, the XNR could carry two people, but Exner – inspired in part by contemporary Indy cars – meant it to be primarily a single-person vehicle, leading to its severely asymmetric shape. The driver's seat sat higher than the passenger's, and the hoodscoop, gauge cluster, windshield, headrest and stabilizer fin all occupied the driver's side of the car in a tip of the hat to the excesses of the jet age.

Some of these styling cues, seriously toned down, ended up on the 1962 Plymouth and Dodge designs by Exner, which were created in 1957 after he recovered from the heart attack that sidelined him during the design of the 1961 cars.

Appropriately, Exner – then Chrysler's vice president of styling –



chose to power the XNR with a 170-cu. in. slant-six engine built to NASCAR specifications with a Hyper-pak intake manifold, four-barrel carburetor, ported cylinder head, high-performance camshaft, and split exhaust.

To get a short, sporting wheelbase, he chose to base the XNR on Plymouth's new Valiant chassis, upon which Ghia then draped a body made entirely of steel. In initial tests by Chrysler, the XNR hit 146 MPH.

Exner wanted the car for himself, but due to import restrictions, it was shipped back to Ghia after it completed the American show circuit, and was sold privately, ending up in hiding in Beiruit for most of Lebanon's 15-year civil war. The car was unseen for nearly 50 years.
