## Tulip Farm is destination for April 12 tour

Wooden Shoe Tulip Farm has a Woodburn, Oregon, address – although

it's not particularly close to Woodburn. On a roadmap, look south of Canby and east of Woodburn to find the Meridian Road location.

There are food vendors at the farm, so no other lunch stop is being planned.

## Website acknowledges Plymouths Clubs' assistance

Both CPPC and the national Plymouth Owners club received gracious mention on a local historical website after helping to identify a "mystery car" last month.

P&C Tools, founded by the Peterson and Carlborg families, manufactured tools locally until 1941, when they were acquired by another company.

J. Johnson, a Carlborg descendant, has created a website documenting the early history of P&C Tools, and appealed for help identifying a company car.

It was a 1929 Fargo, the light truck Chrysler Corporation produced until it acquired Dodge. The query went nationwide, with Lanny Knutson and Jim Benjaminson chiming in from National, as well as Robin Will and Gary (probably Rusher?) providing input locally. It was generous of J. Johnson to include our club in his acknowledgements on his website.



## Skyline Memorial Gardens offers July 5 car event


On Saturday, July 5, Skyline Memorial Gardens opens its gates to a multipurpose fireworks-viewing and car event.

## Several Plymouths and lots of fun at Portland Roadster Show

The Portland Roadster Show was held March 14-15-16 at Portland's Expo Center – an over-the-top expression of our love for the automobile.

There were two CPPC cars at the show (that I recognized anyway – please correct me if I'm wrong, so I can give credit where it's due).

One of them was Mark Childs' 1968 Plymouth Suburban, a car that has been in the club for a while and is now a tailgater with an Oregon State University color scheme.

The other club car was Bill Call's 1942 Plymouth Special Deluxe Business coupe, a rare full-dress car from early in the very short 1942 production run, before chrome and stainless were rationed for the war effort.

There were other Plymouths in the room. Scott Perry's custom 1938 coupe – spectacular in burgundy and taupe – was getting lots of attention. Scott has lots of 1938 parts left over after completing the custom job, and CPPC will be hearing from him when he's ready to sell them off.

We spotted a 1949 Suburban from Keizer – didn't get the owner's name, but he was already familiar with our club. There was a dark blue P-15 club coupe, beautiful but impossible to photograph under the lights, and also a Superbird, one of the wing cars, which was likewise camera-shy.


One of the impressive things at such a high-dollar event was the number of high school and college students who brought cars to the judging. Kudos to the Hot Rod Council for including them.
