

Other: Lauren Matley moved to Arizona and will be in the Great American Race.


Car Quiz: Don Hufschmid asked three car questions. Tonights winners were; John Stafford and Bob Westphal.

Chuck Willis, Mike Bade, Bob and Jeanette Dimick, and Jerry Dixon made the trip out to Dayton that day - on Wednesday, to avoid conflict with summer weekend events.

My convertible had some vacuum and engine problems which I thought were solved, but it still ran rough and I was worried it would fail on the road.

After coffee and pastries I showed everyone how the amp meter ran backwards and the gas gauge needle was all over the place, never reading correctly.

The theories began to flow and it was agreed we should look at the battery connection. We found the battery to be connected as a negative ground and it should be a positive ground.

The wires were confirmed with a continuity tester and the battery cables were changed to a positive ground. I started the car and it ran better, amp meter was reading correctly and the gas gauge was not jumping.

Jerry and Chuck checked my plug wires and found a bad wire. They changed the end and now my car purrs like a kitten.

Pam had lunch ready and I barbecued some brats. We all told some great stories and enjoyed our lunch.

The techs offered advice on my other Plymouth, a 1939 humpback, which is currently in the restoration mode.

Thanks to the techs I can drive to the car shows and not worry that I will be on the side of the road waiting for the hook truck to take us on the rest of our journey.
