The neighborhood was full - too full, if you asked some folks - but Mike Bade, Marlo and Julieann Edmon, Charles and Velva Stewart, Mark Childs, Chuck Willis, Russ Ashley and Herb Watkins were all spotted in the crowd.

ry and Joanne Dixon were leaders of the pack that gathered at the Big Bear in Beaverton and headed for the old Stewart-Stiles truck terminal in Cornelius. Twelve CPPC members and seven cars made the journey.

Just a week later, the annual Parade of Bands was held in Hazeldell, WA, as part of a celebration of Armed Forces Day. Dixons hosted the event, with club members gathering in a staging area before being ushered into the parade. Eight members and five cars from CPPC were involved.

Of the five CPPC cars, four were convertibles - Bades' 1935 Plymouth, Steve Herman's 1937 Plymouth, the Ealys' 1939 Plymouth, plus Westphal's later-model Chrysler. The Ealy and Bade convertibles were taken to the front of the parade to escort dignitaries.

The next big event on CPPC's calen-

dar is the Orphan Car Show, June 20, a Studebaker club event which is a CPPC tradition.



### First three springtime events – in top-down weather!





# Train Ride to Oregon Rail Heritage Center

Saturday April 25th was our train ride event.

And for us diesel fans - an ALCo PA passenger diesel-electric locomotive is displayed inside.

After more than an hour at the Center, departed on the 2:30 train so that we might get earlier seating at our next destination.
