Tech Committee finds Swap Meet project – a 1942 Plymouth Deluxe sedan

CPPC's Tech Committee has occasional purchased "interesting" items they can resell at Portland Swap Meet, but this is the first time they have bought an entire car.

It's a 1942 Plymouth Deluxe sedan that has been sitting in a barn out in East Vancouver since 1964.

It's a familiar story: a family was holding on to "grandpa's car," thinking that one day they might restore it, but finally realizing it wasn't going to happen. They were hoping for a buyer who would treat grandpa's car with respect and were delighted when a CPPC Tech Committee member discovered it.

This 1942 model is rare in its own right. Domestic car production stopped in February, 1942, because of World War II. With war threatening, chromium and stainless steel were rationed as strategic materials, and the later '42s made do with painted trim.

These cars, designated P14S for Deluxe and P14C for Special Deluxe, came back after WWII with only minor modification as the P15, running through early 1949.





The Tech Committee got the tires to hold air, and pulled their new 1942 Plymouth Deluxe onto the trailer with come-alongs. They paused for a photo opportunity before taking the car to Bob Westphal's house, where they'll clean it up a bit and assess what it will take to make this beauty go, and stop.

This car was bought new in Minnesota late in 1941, when cars were still getting their full complement of chrome and stainless steel. Sometime in 1964, the owner had the engine overhauled



The Tech guys got some air in the tires, hitched the sedan onto a trailer with muscle power and a come-along, and the car is currently at Bob Westphal's house being cleaned up and evaluated.

The slick, plaid rayon seat covers were apparently installed at the dealership, and it doesn't appear that they ever came off. The wool upholstery was good underneath. The headliner shows only minor damage.

All of the door handles, dashboard knobs, etc., are there, and so are the rest of the hard-to-find 1942-only pieces.

Towing the '42 up into Westphals' driveway with Gary Rusher at the wheel, it was determined that the engine turns freely, which also means the clutch functions and the transmission isn't frozen.

Randy Ealy has already been on the phone with a potential buyer. We're not saying much (in print, anyway) about what was paid for the car or the anticipated selling price, except to say both CPPC and any potential buyer are going to be happy with the deal on this pretty-good example of a rare car.
