This year the sun was so nice that people didn't come inside. Some folks (obviously not die-hard car people) abandoned the Swap Meet altogether, apparently preferring hiking or yardwork while the sun was shining.

At press time, the Tech Committee was still counting money and adding up expenses, and they'll most likely have a final figure at April's membership meeting.

Sales from the inside booth were not stellar. After paying in advance for next year's booths, CPPC was holding on to about \$500. That's not the worst ever, but it's nowhere near the \$962.88 profit we took home in 2015.

Plus we sold the Tech Committee's "baby," the 1942 Plymouth Sedan that they have been working on for months. That's going to yield a sizeable profit, although there were expenses involved, and we're waiting on a full accounting before committing to a final figure.

Several very attractive items did not sell at the Swap Meet. Sometimes the right person doesn't walk past the booth. Our "EBay & Craiglist Committee" will take over, marketing the good stuff to a national audience. For them, Swap Meet lasts all year, and they bring the club hundreds of dollars worth of online sales each year.

The Tech Committee thanks everybody who showed up to to work, or to help with load-in and load-out, at this year's event.

Tech Committee's '42 Plymouth project goes home - to Boring

Westphals can get to their truck again, and there's a recent arrival in the Lapins' garage, out in Boring.

Phil and Jean Lapin bought the 1942 Plymouth Deluxe sedan that the Tech Committee has been working on since January.

The '42 was sitting in a lean-to, protected from the weather a little bit by stacked firewood, when the tech guys found it in East Vancouver. It had been driven out from Minnesota in 1964, and parked.


The Tech Committee got the '42 running and made sure it would stop, syrprised at how well the car had weathered its 52-year sleep. When the engine runs, it sounds good, but fuel delivery is sketchy, so it doesn't move far under its own power. Phil trailered the car home.

"The transfer went pretty well, considering Bob's sloped driveway and the fact that the car would not keep running (ongoing fuel issue). It therefore had to be pulled onto the trailer. Once it got part way onto the trailer, we realized that the doors could not be opened enough to get in easily. At my end, it got more interesting, as Dennis and I discovered the car was in gear along with having the E brake on. The E brake was not an issue, but trying to push it off the trailer with the engine resisting proved impossible. Then, a stroke of genius. I reached through the open driver window with a short piece of pipe and pushed the clutch in. It worked - the car began rolling. We continued putting in and letting the clutch out to inch the car off a few inches at time, along with a stop block for safety. Dennis was behind the car, letting out a foot or two of cable at a time to act as a safety measure. Ah, yes - the genius of the Technical Committee."
