

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OFF THE HOOK - technical talk from CPPC

This article is the first of many in a new "Tech Talk" feature for our newsletter. Phil Lapin will be editing these articles from member input, previous newsletters and new resources we come across. We are sure you will find them interesting. Enjoy! Randy

Are you thinking of of buying the car you loved in your youth, or the car you would have died for back in the day? Your tech committee has a few tips that may help.

First, consider the condition of the car you're hoping to find, and think about availability and cost of parts. The older the car, plus the smaller the production numbers of that car, the more scarce and expensive the parts will be.

Then think about how much work you can do yourself, or how much can you pay someone to do the work. Hourly cost for body and fender experts can be \$70 or more per hour. You may have paid \$500 for your dream car, but it could cost another \$15,000 plus before you can drive that beauty to a cruise.

Do you have garage space to start your project? Working in a garage out of the weather is better than working in your driveway.

Before you hand over the cash we suggest you call the tech committee. We can help with motor numbers, production numbers, and title information. We can inspect the car visually. If the car is drivable, take it to a mechanic who can put it on a lift for inspection of brake lines, rust,

Plymouth/Dodge trivia

Through the early 1970s, what was a consistent difference between sister Dodge and Plymouth models such as the Dodge Challenger and Plymouth Barracuda?

A. The Dodge version typically had a longer wheelbase and body than the Plymouth.

B. The highest output V8 engines were typically reserved for the Dodge version of the car. Six cylinder motors were only available in the Plymouth.

C. The rear window of the Dodge version was concave while the Plymouth window was at least slightly convex (as viewed from outside the car).

Answer: A.

gas lines, oil leaks, etc.

With the above information, it's easier to judge the approximate worth of the car versus the asking price. This is a good time to determine whether your car will be a daily driver or a frame off restoration trailer queen. Most people opt for the daily driver rather than spending money – and time – on perfection.

Some folks will look on this purchase

as an investment, but a realist will tell you that the money and labor invested to rebuild an older car is usually more than can be recovered later in a sale. Be sure you can afford the risk ratio.

At this point if you are still encouraged to move forward with your dream car, welcome to the Cascade Plymouth Club and our tech committee that is willing to help in your project.

CPPC notes loss as two members pass in two days

Don Hufschmid

Donald Keith Hufschmid passed away February 27, 2017 from respiratory complications related to his LVAD (Left Ventricular Assist Device). The device gave Don an additional 26 months after his second episode of congestive heart failure in 2014. He was 73 years old.

After recovering from the LVAD implant surgery Don was an ambassador for the Providence St. Vincent Medical Center Ventricular Assist Devices team. He met with VAD patients and health-care professionals to offer help based on his experiences. "I guess that's why I'm still here" was his frequent refrain.

Don grew up in Seaside and the Lents neighborhood of Portland. After graduating from Madison High School he served in the U.S. Army; attended college in Oklahoma City; and lived in Des Moines, Iowa. Eventually he and his family relocated to Portland.

Cars and trucks were a focal point in his life as the owner of One Two Three Truck Sale and as a member of the Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club and Historic Auto Club of Oregon.

Don's met Lorraine Griffey, in 2004. They traveled; enjoyed local live theatre and music; belonged to the Broadway Rose Theatre Guild; entertained frequently; and were active with The Laurelhurst Dance Club.

One of the organizations close to his heart was the Bethel Youth Drop In Center (YDIC) after school and summer programs for children in North Portland. Last summer he sponsored a field trip for 50+ kids to go swimming, including transportation and ice cream afterward.

Don is survived by his son, David; nephew Richard Tunzat and his family; niece Marjorie Ellen Leonetti; and his Extended Portland Family who will miss his boundless energy, humor, and opinions.

At Don's insistence there was a party instead of a memorial service on Friday, March 10, 2017 at The Laurelhurst Club, 3721 SE Ankeny Street in Portland from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m.

Bruce Alan Kerslake, 68, Vancouver, died Feb. 25, 2017, when the cancer he had been fighting spread to his brain.

Bruce was a member of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club, the northwest chapter of Studebaker Drivers Club, Pacific Wonderland WPC (Chrysler Club), a local club for owners of American Motors cars, and possibly others.

He was extraordinarily knowledgeable about American cars, correctly answered more Car Quiz questions correctly than anybody else in CPPC.
